Employment

Project Manager, Curator & Arts Consultant - self employed (2010 – present)

I have worked as an independent consultant, project manager and curator developing and delivering projects in the public realm since 2010. I've written public art plans and strategies for public and private sector clients including universities, local authorities, developers and housing associations. I've project managed for art consultancies Field Art Projects, Willis Newson, Ginkgo Projects and T Projects. I was an Associate Lecturer at Bath Spa University and am currently working on several projects. I sit on the board of IXIA the national public art thinktank. My projects often involve working closely with local communities and residents. Further details about specific current and past projects are included on my Project Sheet and on my website.

Public art project management; ensuring successful project delivery, including liaising with fabricators and contractors; writing public art plans and strategies for the public realm; fundraising; artist research and curating artist longlists for client selection; overseeing artist selection, appointment and management; writing artist briefs and contracts; client liaison; creative community engagement; giving presentations; managing project budgets and timescales; overseeing press and marketing, including writing material for, and maintaining websites and social media.

A temporary (3 year) public commission to be sited in the grounds of a grand historic property (now a ruin) managed by English Heritage. This is the first project to be delivered within English Heritage's new national Creative Programme. The artist brief is currently under development, with an artist to be appointed in February 2022.

Filwood Pool, Knowle West, Bristol (2021 – present)

Services: Artist brief development, curation/artist research, overseeing artist selection, contracting, design development, liaising with stakeholders, community representatives and Bristol City Council

This project is likely to result in an off-site commission associated with a housing development of 38 houses and apartments designed by architects Stride Treglown. Funded through a planning condition, there are limited opportunities within the public realm of the site, so discussions are ongoing with Bristol City Council to explore how this project could support the wider rejuvenation of the public realm in Knowle West and Filwood Broadway.

North Road, Engine Common, South Gloucestershire (2021 – present)

Budget: £25k (exc fees)

Services: Artist brief development, curation/artist research, overseeing artist selection, contracting, design development, liaising with South Gloucestershire Council

Funded through a planning condition associated with a development of 84 homes, this commission will be a permanent project within the green space of the site, likely to be associated with the cycle hub planned for the eastern edge of the site which connects into a cycleway.

The Grove, Lodge Road, Engine Common, South Gloucestershire (2021 – present)

Client: Cotswold Homes (2021 – present)

Budget: £10k

Services: Artist brief development, curation/artist research, overseeing artist selection, contracting, design development, liaising with South Gloucestershire Council, liaison with North Road Primary School

Funded by a development of 31 homes, this small project will involve joint working with the local primary school to produce an offsite project on the school grounds funded by the housing developer. The project is at brief development stage.

Lyde View, Emerson's Green, Bristol (2021 - present)

Budget: £7,500 (exc fees)

Services: Artist brief development, curation/artist research, overseeing artist selection, contracting, design development, liaising with South Gloucestershire Council

A temporary creative commission associated with a development of 115 new homes on the eastern edge of Bristol. Local artist and ceramicist Phil Root was appointed to develop a proposal and has now completed detailed design stage. The project to date has included community participation through pottery making workshops at nearby Brandy Bottom Colliery using clay dug from the housing development site, and the construction of a medieval style kiln where the work was fired. The commission will result in a small 'multiple' work gifted to each new resident of the development by its completion in October 2022.

The art plan by Suzanne Heath was signed off by South Gloucestershire Council in 2017. The first commission by Jo Lathwood, a temporary structure was installed in Summer 2021. The artist for the second commission, Phil Cuttance, is creating a new work responding to the history of celestine quarrying on the site,

This commission by Nika Neelova fulfils a challenging brief for a £12m office development with very limited public open space. The resulting artwork is a sculptural mural applied to the façade of the building consisting of 170 cast tiles made of ground stone dust collected by the artist from disused quarries surrounding Cheltenham. The stone dust is suspended in Jesmonite and each tile has been individually cast by the artist, creating the appearance of a geological strata pattern.
